

REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1: TITLE AND ORGANIZER

The Haute-Vienne Meeting is organized by LIMOGES ATHLÉ 87, represented by its President Jean-Luc Quintin, and, by delegation, the Meeting Director, Yoann Cabirol.

ARTICLE 2: INDOOR CHALLENGER MEETING

This meeting is part of the indoor meeting circuit.
Its organization complies with the European Athletics regulations and requirements.

ARTICLE 3: CONFIRMATION OF ENTRY

Entries must be made directly to the Meeting Director, Mr. Yoann Cabirol.
An information circular will be sent to managers outlining all participation conditions.
Only entries confirmed by an official email from the organization will be considered final.

The athletes' meeting point on the day of the event is CHEOPS 87, located at:
55 rue de l'Ancienne École Normale, 87000 Limoges.
Upon arrival at the stadium, your bib number will be provided in the warm-up area.

Athletes and managers are kindly requested to show courtesy and respect toward the volunteer team.

Interpreters will be available at all key locations to assist you. There are no entry fees, and no on-site registrations will be accepted.

ARTICLE 4: TRAVEL EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

Travel expenses may be reimbursed for all athletes finishing in the top eight, provided they have achieved a performance equal to or above the National 2 standard of the French Athletics Federation (FFA) rankings.

Reimbursement options are as follows:

- Round-trip SNCF train ticket (2nd class) from the address registered in the FFA club database (SIFFA), up to a maximum of €150; or
- €0.14 per kilometer (round trip), including tolls and parking fees, up to a maximum of €200, calculated from the athlete's registered SIFFA address; or
- Economy-class airfare (round trip), up to a maximum of €150 for domestic flights, or €250 for international flights.

The reimbursement form, available for download on the Meeting website and provided upon arrival at the hotel, must be submitted signed (or accompanied by an invoice) along with all supporting documents.

Payment will be made within forty-five (45) days following the validation of results by the AFLD (French Anti-Doping Agency).

Requests submitted more than six months after this date will not be accepted.

ARTICLE 5: PRIZE SCALE

The table of podium and performance bonuses is available for download on the Meeting website.

Prize Payment Regulations

Except in the case of a delay caused by an anti-doping control, prize payments will be made upon submission of a reimbursement request or an invoice made out to LIMOGES ATHLÉ 87, sent either by email to the Meeting Director or by post to the following address: 6 rue de Saint-Gence, 87100 Limoges.

These prizes require the athlete to be available for press, protocol, and public engagements, and to have achieved a minimum National 2 performance level. Any failure to comply with these obligations will result in a renegotiation of the agreement.

ARTICLE 6 : PRIZE REGULATIONS

Except in the case of a delay caused by an anti-doping control, the payment of prizes shall be made no later than April 30, 2026, upon submission of a reimbursement request or an invoice made out to LIMOGES ATHLE 87.

Each winning athlete is required to make themselves available for the press, protocol, and public.

A minimum performance level of N2 must have been achieved.

Any failure to comply with these obligations will result in the cancellation of the payment of the corresponding prize.

ARTICLE 7 : ACCOMMODATION AND CATERING

For athletes who are unable to make the round trip to Limoges on the day of the meeting, the organizer may cover one night of accommodation at Cheops 87. This coverage is subject to prior approval by the Meeting Management and will only take effect after written confirmation (by email).

Shuttle services will be provided to ensure transfers between the train station/airport – hotel – Marie-José Pérec arena.

Meals (dinner and/or breakfast) will be provided in partner establishments according to arrangements that will be communicated at a later date.

ARTICLE 8 : SPECIFIC REGULATIONS – TRIPLE JUMP

The triple jump competition is limited to a maximum of 12 athletes.

Each participant will have three qualifying attempts. After these three attempts, the eight best performances will be granted three additional attempts.

The order of attempts, call-up times, and technical conditions will comply with the current regulations of World Athletics and the French Athletics Federation (FFA).

ARTICLE 9 : MEDICAL

A physiotherapist will be present on-site throughout the meeting to provide appropriate treatment and care to athletes when needed.
